THE ART OF STORY-DANCE

'Great Stories Inspire change'. Wakakirri is a National Story-Dance Festival for schools that develops student engagement and wellbeing through participation in the Performing Arts

Schools participate by creating Story-Dances that they perform at live theatres in cities and selected regional areas around Australia. Schools who cannot attend a live event can participate via Wakakirri Video.

Each year schools create and perform Story-Dances for Wakakirri that reflect students' ideas and aspirations. Schools will explore themes and concepts that address various topics such as: environmental, social, cultural, health, historical, entertainment & stories about reconciliation are all popular themes.

Wakakirri is open to all types of Primary & Secondary schools, Dance Studios and Community Groups.



ARTS EDUCATION AT ITS BEST!

Australia's largest performing arts event for schools!

Founded in 1992 from a government youth enterprise business scheme by school teacher Matthew Samuel and production manager Adam Loxley who wanted to expose more young people to the positive outcomes created by participation in the Performing Arts.

Wakakirri means 'to dance' according to the Wangaaypuwan people from Cobar, NSW. Wakakirri chose the name to give the event a uniquely Australian feel.

Today Wakakirri is Australia's largest performing arts event for schools.

- The Wakakirri Primary School Challenge became a national event in 1998.
- The 'not-for-profit' Wakakirri Association Inc. was established in 2005.
- In 2013 the Victorian Wakakirri Secondary School Challenge was created with the support of the Victorian Government in response to the demise of the High School Rock Eisteddfod.

WHAT IS A STORY-DANCE?

A Wakakirri Story Dance is a 3-7 minute student performance utilising a combination of dancing, creative movement and acting to pre-recorded music. Schools can tell any story that has a clear progression using costumes, sets, props, lighting, projection, hair & make-up to enhance their performance and send that message!

Participating schools create a Story-Dance to perform in a professional theatre to audiences that consist of families, friends, and the wider community. The show is also attended by the National Ambassadors who will award schools for their creatively in different categories. Schools who cannot attend a live performance can send their entry in via video.

Wakakirri is open to all schools (public and private), dance studios and community groups. Students with any level of experience can participate. An importance is placed on creative movement and drama rather than technical dance. Emphasis is also placed on inventive storytelling and sustainability, not expensive and extravagant productions. Wakakirri encourages schools to minimise their footprint when creating productions with special recognition to schools that excel in this area.

A unique sense of camaraderie develops among the students, as participants spend Show Day rehearsing and engaging with other schools at the student function with our Ambassadors and perform live on stage. Each production is filmed for our online showcase.



Costs

Wakakirri Live: \$39.00 per student and includes certificates and a digital copy of your school's performance. Additional costs include props, costumes and transport to the theatre.

Wakakirri Video: \$200 per entry and includes screening, certificates and feedback.


DISADVANTAGED SCHOOLS SUPPORT

"The impact of our schools involvement in Wakakirri is reflected in our students sense of belonging."

The Wakakirri Inspiration Fund raises funds to help schools in disadvantaged communities participate in Wakakirri.

Funded by donations, the Wakakirri Inspiration Fund directly assists disadvantaged schools by covering the cost of participation fees.

- Any school can apply.
- Schools with an ICSEA of less than 1000 are prioritised.
- Schools that have never participated in Wakakirri before are prioritised.
- Applications must be received before the yearly funding cycles close in April.
- Average subsidy to school \$1000.


