FESTIVAL DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Registrations for Wakakirri 2022 were up on 2021 but did not fully bounce back to pre covid numbers. This was due to the uncertainty surrounding schools as they returned to classroom learning with Covid continuing to cause disruptions. Despite this registrations were still strong enough for Wakakirri to deliver a successful season across Australia and is well positioned bounce back to in 2023

Some outcomes from 2022 include:

- Registrations for the Artist In Residence programs are becoming more popular.
- Wakakirri launched its Artist in Residence Kick Start program which uses a pre designed story-line and online dance classes to deliver a low cost entry point program for new schools into Wakakirri. The AIR Kick Start program was also adapted for use by remote schools
- The Wakakirri Artist in Residence Program has contracted to be a preferred supplier for the Smith Family's SMARTS program and delivered programs into 7 schools
- Updates to the live show format allowed Wakakirri shows to take place in smaller and more affordable venues. This means long and expensive events at venues such as the Adelaide entertainment centre can be avoided
- Many administration tasks have been automated and streamlined to create a more efficient and cost effective system
- The Wakakirri website experienced a serious DOS attack in March which led to an upgrade of security across all systems



WAKAKIRRI 2022 PROGRAMS AND EVENTS

WAKAKIRRI STORY-DANCE FESTIVAL

The Wakakirri Story-Dance Festival is a national program for schools that develops student engagement and wellbeing through participation in the performing arts.

Schools participate by creating Story-Dances which they perform in live theatres in capital cities and selected regional areas around Australia. Schools in remote and regional areas can participate via Wakakirri Video.

NATIONAL SHOWCASE SPECIAL

At the end of the live and video seasons at National showcase special is celebrated via the Wakakirri website and social media channels that showcases outstanding works from the year



ARTIST IN RESIDENCE PROGRAM

The Wakakirri Artist in Residence provides assistance to schools that do not have the resources or skills to participate in Wakakirri. Combined with online dance classes the AIR program can also be used by schools in remote areas.

WAKAKIRRI INSPIRATION FUND

The Wakakirri Inspiration Fund directly assists disadvantaged schools by covering the cost of participation fees or an artist in residence program.

CAREER PATHWAYS PROGAM

Via Wakakirri, secondary students have the option to explore career pathways in performing and creative arts, design, and event management. Participating students have access to industry professional mentors, careers day seminars and the option of completing a Certificate 2 in Dance.

2022 FESTIVAL MOTIF 'RISE'

The Wakakirri team has chosen 'RISE' as its 30th birthday motif for 2022. RISE represents optimism and change after the adversity of the last two years.

2022 NATIONAL AWARDS

Wakakirri is not a competition but does have awards that acknowledge schools who exemplify the Wakakirri ethos 'Great Stories Inspire Change' including raising awareness, community building and excellence in performing arts. Following is a selection of sponsored award winning schools

Responding to the question "who-made-my-clothes?" their Story-Dance work reveals the hands behind the clothes we wear. "We were inspired by the 30th birthday signature motif of representing optimism and change. We are optimistic that involvement this year will provide hope for our students and a chance to change their lives".






PUBLIC SCHOOLS VERSUS PRIVATE SCHOOLS



TOTAL # STUDENTS BY YEAR


TOTAL # SCHOOLS BY YEAR





Wakakirri can provide qualified Performing Arts Facilitators that can come to your school and do most of the heavy lifting needed to create a story-dance performance.





All funds raised go directly to participating schools.






FREE WAKAKIRRI CAREER DAY SEMINAR
